Mr. H. G. Wells, embarking on a lecture tour, was soon waylaid by newsreels and the Press. He at once got down to the bedrock realities of the Second World War:-

WELLS SPEAKS:

"You ask how do I think the war will end. Supposing it doesn't. Supposing the process of social disintegration which is evidently going on now all over Europe and the East - suppose it goes on into chaotic dissolution of the social order.

"Is peace possible in the world any more. I think it is but that means common understanding between three great communities which are at present not by any means in a state of unanimity: America, the British system and Russia. They have it in their power to take control of air transport and the air throughout the world and if they did so they would not only make peace in the air but they would lay the foundation for universal peace."
