The first issue of a newspaper by Germans for Germans, and sold without restriction in this country, was the latest proof that Britain is fighting for freedom, for minorities as well as for the rest.

Herr Reichenheim is probably the only German news editor in Europe at liberty to print the facts.

Her Lothar is the only German editor who can send down to the linotype men his own opinions, instead of the rubber-stamp Goebbels variety. The Zeitung goes to press at a well-known printers. For various reasons its circulation is kept secret. It brings a reminder of the buried liberties of the Fatherland to exiled Germans.
