FOOD CALAVANS FULLOW RAIDS.

In the courtyard of Buckingham Palace sixteen vehicles designed to rush meals to bombed towns were inspected by Her Majesty. The name 'Queen's Messengers' has been given to them, and as the Queen herself presented a complete convoy of cars the name is well chosen. It was suggested by Lord Woolton, who was in attendance. Americans of the British War Relief Society have subscribed the great sum of £80,000 to equip eighteen convoys - 144 vehicles in all - enough to service the whole country.

Each convoy has two kitchen cars, capable of providing 2,000 meals an hour. The Queen had a look at the arrangements in one of the kitchens she presented herself. Each convoy is completed by a water-carrier, two store-wagons and two camteens. Women of the voluntary service will cook and serve. The generosity of Her Majesty and the Americans earns the nation's gratitude.
