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Where Piccadilly meets Park Lane Mayfair now meets the masses, to the extent of opening a communal feeding centre. It's been given an attractive name by the Westminster City Council which started the restaurant, and on opening day it did brisk business under the management of the Women's Voluntary Service.

There's no French chef at St. George's Restaurant. It's homely fare; roast meat, cold meat and then rissoles - Park Lane learning there's a war on.

The cafeteria principle cuts waiting down to a minimum. About 500 people now lunch here every day, a good many of them from the fighting services and the local A.R.P. A good lunch for a shilling, and other meals at a similar price, shows what can be done by communal feeding, even in Park Lane. What's the matter with Park Lane, anyway ?
