VESSEL HERE WITH AIRMEN, MISSIONARIES

The shiplord of Ansac airmen bound for Canada and England monopolised attention and passenger space today when a vessel arrived from the Antipodes.

Also abourd were about 150 other passengers, most of whom are to continue to the coast when the ship sails at 4 p.m. today.

Next in size to the Ansae centingent was the group of 75 missionaries and educators who left the middle east in May to escape danger during the British invasion of Syria. Head of the party is Dr. Harry Dorman, missionary doctor who has been connected with the medical school and hespital of the American university in Beirut, Syria. It took Dr. Dorman, his wife, his son, Domald and other members nearly four months to reach Homolulu. They waited for transportation a month in Palestine and 41 days in Caire.
