## CENERAL DEFORMATION

This is the first Army-built, strictly military railroad in the history of the mation. On this fifty wile stretch of railroad men are trained to become capable reailroaders. Into this railroad the filth Operating Battalion assisted by Army Engineers, built all the handicaps and hazards which railroad troops might have to face in taking over a road on the bools of an invasion and operating it under combat conditions. Here soldier-railroaders learn how to build a shoofly quickly around a bombed piece of track, how to use a detour map, how to get a train to its destination regardless of the "difficulties" on route. From the Clairborns-Polk Military Railroad, railroad troops have gone to practically every Theater of Operations. The Military Railway Service now is operating railroads on five continents. Army railronders are operating over 1,000 miles of read in Italy, backing up the American Fifth Army and the British Eight Army. The Allied push into Burma is supported by their operation of over 700 miles of the vital Bengal-Assem Railway in India.
