B-26's coming in over [redacted] coast at dawn-location of target- coast
fortifications near [redacted] altitude 4500
ft. Formation of B-26s against rising sun over invasion scene.

Boats of invasion fleet to left.

Shell burst from warship under formation of B-26s over coast.
Smoke screen being laid by typhoon near water between warships
and beach. Camera misses the shell which hit the smoke layer but
gets the flame on water where he hit.

Warships guns flashing thru mist of shore.

Stick of 16 250 lb GP bombs out of B-26 to target hit at 0624 exactly
on schedule. Excellent hits scored and recorded.

3000 heavies, 700 mediums and 4000 fighters support first American
force of 500,000 to invade the "Festung Europa". On June 6, 1944
4 years to day after Dunkirk. Some of force shown over clouds
against rising sun [redacted]

Two B-26s wheel away at low altitude from clouds of light flak cut
across [redacted] toward home.
