4,000 officers and men of the 8th.Army nearly all of them Catholics, were received by the Holy Father in audience on June 20th, and heard his Holiness speaking in English, say:

"It is a real joy for us to welcome you all hear within the very home

of the Common Father of Christendom."

The troops went to the Vatican after assisting the Mass in the hurch of St. Mary Of The Angels. 'celebrated Wrather Scanlan Standartholic Chaplain of the 8th assisted by Canadian, Newzetaland and South African Chaplains.

General Leese, Commander of the 8th Army, was represented at the Mass by Brigadier Siggers. The Holy Father was recieved with great applause when he entered the Home of the Blessings - over the main entrance of St. Peter's - to address the troops. After his opening words of welcome and continuing to speak in English, his Holiness said:

"God has provided that we should be the Common Father at a part of Human history when the world as never before is afflicted with suffering and distress unmeasured and you know very well how our Paternal Heart at times has been almost overwhelmed by the sorrows of our children. You

are of those children, and we have paid for you."

We had the privilege of passing in the great capital of the British Empire. (His Holiness was referring to his visit to London as a Member of the Papal Mission for the coronation of King George V.) "but also your presence recalls other memories - Memories of those Herces of the Faith, Saint Edward, and Saint Thomas O'Becket, and Saint John Fisher and Saint Thomas Moore. To their protection we command you all. We know only too well the dangers and unsertainties of war. In the midst of these, make one thing certain - keep faithfull always to God. To the Intercession of those Saintly Sons of Mother Church and your Beloved England we command you and all your dear ones at home"

When the Holy Father gave his Blessing loud applause harmed out again. Many of the soldiers took the opportunity to kiss the Pope's hands as his Holiness left the Hall on the "SEDIA GESTATORIA", they sang "Faith of our Fathers". On the way through adjoining SALA REGIA the Holy Father paused to Bless other troops of the 8th Army who had been unable to find room in the Hall but had listened to his address through loud speakers.
