Roll 1.

Scenes at Malmedy, Belgium as German civilians of the town of Kalterherberg, Germany are brought to Malmedy where they will be unable to disclose the position, etc. of American troops and artillery to the enemy. Various scenes of the trucks unloading and closeups of types and attitudes of the people being evacuated.

Roll 2.

Scenes of Kalterherberg- the entire populace of the town being rounded up and shipped to Malmedy, Belgium where they will be unable to help the enemy with information and sabotage.

Roll 3.

Various closeups and long shots of the civilians being loaded upon 2½ ton trucks to be shipped to Malmedy.

Roll 4.

Many and various closeups of types of civilians and studies in their attitudes as they are forced to leave their homes. More closeups as above as they wait shipment in the village church yard.

Roll 5.

German family shown leaving their home and joining the waiting throng of villagers. Long shot of evacuees marching to transportation point with their belongings.

Roll 6.

Group of 49 Civilian men left to take care of the cattle and live stock of the village, receive their instructions from a representative of the MGP, at the Burgomasters home in the town above.

NOTE:

V. Corps Allied Military Government Police doing the evacuation work.

DESCRIPTION: The film shipped herewith is of the bombing of Aachen Germany by U.S. airforce in 11 October, 1944 after the German forces in the town had failed to surrender in reply to an ultimatum issued to them at 1600 hours 10 October 1944. The photos were taken from a former training camp (German) now occupied by troops of the ~~100th~~ Inf. Div.

DESCRIPTION : ROLL 1  
Shows P/S Bruce A Logan of Walnut Ridge, Ark. and Pfc. Lawrence Rine of Wheeling, W. Va. (Both are from Co E 2nd Bn. ~~30th Regt., 90th Div.~~) fixing coffee on the front lines near Germeter, Germany.

ROLL 2

Show members of Co E holding off enemy at the edge of a clearing. I shot as many close ups as movement permitted none were posed.

ROLL 3

Is also shot at the edge of the same clearing as roll 2 which shows wounded being picked up and prisoners pulled back from the ~~front~~ line of fire.

ROLL 4 & 5

Show Sherman Tanks bogged in mud, trying to get out. The tanks are from the ~~46th Bn.~~ The tanks were supporting the Inf, until they were unable to move on.

Rolls 1 to 6

People come from all over to the assembly area. Both German nationals and Belgium civilians must evacuate the area by military (U.S.) order. Both for their own safety and for ours. In the course of evacuations of areas near here, in the immediate area a good many Nazi soldiers in civilian dress were located. The people are assembled in this large courtyard, identified at the desks, checked off by French and German speaking U.S. soldiers. Separating German nationals from Belgium the people are helped aboard the 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ 's; while a group is left behind to tend the homes and livestock. M.P.'s place "off limits" signs on all civilian property. A 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ' enters a camp in Malmady, Belgium, and hers u under auspices the A.R.C. German nationals are billeted, fed, and taken care of.

After the Germans had refused the offer to surrender the city of Aachen to the First Army, long range artillery and P-47Is and P-38's dive bombers begin the job of reducing the city to a heap of rubble.

NOTE. These shots were taken from an observation post overlooking the city about two miles away. Because of the distance I was away from the town, I doubt whether these pictures will show very much action.
