ROLL 3	(McCaughey roll/93)
	This entire roll is of the Germans shelling and machine gunning, our craft as they approach FLUSHING. Used 2" and 6" telephoto - bix teken from pill box on shore at BRESKENS - pointing directly across to FLUSHING. Our guns were laying a barrage on the FLUSHING shore also and some shell buy its may be ours.
OLL 4	(McCaucher, roll 94)
	Several small LCA's (ours) went out to lay a smoke sorsen. The Germans shelled them and these are jix of the attack. There is one shot here that I believe is a direct hit by a shell on a smoke laying craft. It has close in to our shore - taken with 2" lens. The smoke gradually drifted in until my vision was olouded.
ROLL 5	(Mcdaughey, roll 95)
	The smoke drifted into the docks where the Commandos were loading supplies. These are shots of them unloading ammunition and supplies and taking them onto the wharf. Typhoons gave air cover - tried to get a shot of them.
ROLL 6	(McCaughey, roll 96)
GU	SIR BERTALL HAMSAY & CAPT MAUDE of the Royal Navy enter a lorry for a conference sutside of Erigade H.Q. Breskens. In support of the two allied landings on WALCHEREN ISLAND to take FLUSHING and clear a way there to the port of ANTWERP, the 240mm guns of the <u>Srd super heavy Rest</u> are working overtime pounding the jerry on the island with 364 lbs shells. All through the night and long into the day there guns and every other type of Arty weapon crashed out their songs of destruction.
