## ATHENS REVEALS ELAS OUTRAGES

TH CHINK ON WEDNESDAY, ARODROMES AT HENGTANG AND SOUTH

The whole truth is gradually coming out of Athens.

As always in civil war the ordinary people were
the main sufferers. When the capital was cleared
of Elas forces many inhabitants of Athens came
back to ruined homes. Even those with a roof
over their heads seldmm had fuel.

The British Army has come through, with high reputation unsullied, at the end of the most thankless task of the present war. It now helps to distribute hot food to the many hundreds who had nothing with which to cook.

In a quarry on the outskirts of the city the maimed and tortured bodies of seventy people were dug up.

They had been murdered by Elas soldiers.

For a few days there were still occasional riots.

Rioters taken prisoner in these little engagements were deloused. The method was invented during this war and has been a boon to millions of soldiers.

Field Marshal Alexander deserves much credit for his handling of a grave situation. The Greek Guard of Monour, however, was not for him but for the Regent, Archbishop Damaskinos, whom he was now meeting.

The Regent is one of the few people in Greece at the moment respected by 90% of the people. The British kts
Army, here in parade dress to salute MXK commanders, also stands high in the esteem of Athens. The capital owes a great deal to Field Marshal Alexander and General Scobie.
