On Xmas eve in the small village of Bande the Gormans massacred 34 men. On their arrival a few days earlier they adopted a menacing attitude. They ordered all Belgian and allied flags to be headed over; some were some were not but they didn't carry out their threat to search the houses if the orders were not carried out. All the men of the village and those evacuated there were rounded up and were told that they were going to be sent to Germany for forced labour; but the men over 35 were sent home. The youngest was 16. The men were than told that the Gestapo was going to take revenge for German soliders killed by the Patriots last Sontember. The 35 were asked to give the names of three Communists in the village. None answered, although threatened with death. then further questioned, robbed of their valuables and beaten in an effort to make them speak. They were then lead, one by one, to one of the houses which had been previously burnt as a reprisal, shot in the back of the neck and pushed into the vacant cellar. The bodies were half covered with boards but were not found till the airborne forc s liberated the village. The cold weather had kept the bodies from disintrigating, and they still show all the signs of the beating. Four of the victims were trained priests. One Youth, 20 year old what was he proming tried, in volue to persuade the others to fight for it.
He, however, whilst being lead to the house to be knocked his guard out and boilted. Although fired at by 13 Garmans escaped untouched, and letterned and hid in the self same VP 201 The bodies were taken to the nearyby Cafe de La Poste it being the nearest building with a roof. It is suspected that some were actually sent to Germany. Christmasses at Bando in future will hardly be a time for rejoycing. Suggest you see the National Papers of about the 14th for their stories. From now on I shall believe every atrocity story.

In Cordemiac, France, which was declared by the treaty to be neutral territory, the train with refugees arriving from St. Mazaire was brought in to a halt, and the German officials on the train dismounted. They were replaced by the French soldiers who road with the train to Chantenay, France, where the refugees are to be processed.

This roll shows the train entering the neutral territeory and coming to a halt. The train has a large French

Red Cross emblem on the front of the locomotive. The French soldiers approach and mount the train. One of the young French refugees kisses the soldier in the excitement of the moment. Then the train pulls out of the neutral territory to the French lines. There is a scene showing the box cars into which the refugees are loaded, passing a group of German soldiers, as the refugees and the French guard on the train lean out for a last look at their enemies

before entering Allied teritory.

At 4.0 pm to-day 18 January 1945, at the town of Chantenay, a suburb of Mantes, France, the return of the train from St. Nazaire, overflowing with refugees was completed. The train pulled into the siding and one car at a time was centered at a concrete platform, where the occupants of the box cars were guided into an abandoned factory, hastily converted to process the refugees. Once inside the factory walls, formerly a sugar factory of "Couvin-Yvose", those of the refugees who needed medical attention were attended by members of the French Red Cross, while the others were guided on into the screening section of the factory. The prosess of the screening included: lat. Division of the refugees by the region in which they came in, St. Nazaire 2nd

After the complete screening, the refugees were allowed to leave the area, where they were met by civilians of Nantes, who as their sponsors guarantee the evacuees shelter and food.



A tank is seen crossing a small bridge going forward, a string of prisoners are seen going back, reflectiong in a stream. (Had magasine trouble herd... camera running too slow)
