Troops of the 15th Indian corps sailed up the Rangeon River in their Landing Craft Assault (L.C.A.)

Right by into the port, passing eranes, jettics and all types of installations which had been rendered temporarily useless wither by Allied bombers or Jap demolition squads who in the last few days before our attack worked fremsiedly on any equipment which could be of use to us.

The ships thed up in China team, The joyous population threw British fire enckers at curfect, as we marched ashere. Indian and Russian treops soaked to their skins by the first Monseon rains, bedraggled elive green battle grees, were the first in the team thus beating the Fourteenth Army in the race for Rangoome

I he town itself is a scene of deselation, No water system in operation, no severage, no electricity, or gas. Small oil hamps provide the towns illumination, wells in the main streets provide water, and the filth provides the breeding ground for the disease carrying flics.

Bombs exploding (very bad visibility). L. G.A's fullow in to the Beach. Entrance to Mangeon River. Aircraft diving and shooting up hats etc. L. G. guns pass a Jap Dump set on fire by Bombing. The Fires in the village of Chemne Wa Pronounced Chemne Wa.

BCK 2 .

Healing up gans after landing. Bulldoser bails truck and gun up slope from L.C.T. Making a ramp to land guns. A native (Madrassie) tells an officer when the Japs left. Huge fire started near Beach Head.

BOX 3

Troops disembark from L.C.T and get stuck in the sud and are helped by the Burnese boys from a near by village. The Burnese turn out to watch the landing. Troops moving away from the Beach head to Rangoon watched by the Natives.

BOX 4

Burmese help to haul a perambulator up through the mid. A "walkie talkie" is taken ashere. The Burmese beys are interested spectators.

BOX 6

The Convoy moving up the River. G U R H W A L I Troops pronounced Goowali approaching Rangoon. Entering the Jettice. First view of Habiyes

BOX 7

Entering the Jettics. First view of Natives. The Jetty Hotel, Church and Secretariat. The L.C's go in. Passing the Jettics. Cheering growds of Chinese, Indian and Burmese.
