Arrival at Long Kesh Air Field King and Queen & Princess Elizabeth step from plane (this was the Princesses first flight) Their Graces' the Governor and Duchess of Abercorn were present and received Their Majesties.

Arrival at Houses of Parliament. Inspection of Guard of Honour. Mounting steps and entering buildings.

Several shots of arrival at Botanic Gardens to Garden Party given to five thousand war workers - speaking to Miss May Thompson, munition worker never absent or late in four years.

Several shots of party being mobbed by war workers - followed by shots speaking with kids and workers.

Arrival on board Petrol Yacht Lisahally. Proceed up river (passing 62 Gorman boats to Londonderry Quay) Arrival at Londonderry quay. Several shots in Guilhall Square of reception & march past. Lady Montgomery presents banquet to Princess.

NOTE: Poor story best material would have been in Government House (speech) etc. but filming not permitted by government.

2.	<u>Reel Two.</u> The Royal party arriving at Parliament Buildings, Stormont. The Queen & Princess Elizabeth talking to members of the British Legion outside Stormont. Walking up the steps at Stormont.				
3.	The Royal Party arriving at the Royal Courts of Justice and being received by the Lord Chief Justice, Sir James Andrews. --				
4.	<u>Reel Three.</u> At the Botanic Gardens, Belfast, where the Royal party met 5000 war workers invited to a Garden Party. Talking to some of the war workers. Londonderry. Arrival at St. Columbs Cathedral, The party walking on the ancient City walls near the Cathedral. --				
5.	<u>Reel Four.</u> H.M.S. "Heniesta", with the Royal party aboard, leaving the jetty at Lisahally for the journey up the River Foyle to Londonderry. The "Heniesta" en route, passing German surrendered submarines on right of picture. (Long way off). Passing ships with crews lining decks. "Heniesta" coming alongside at Princes Quay, Londonderry.				
6.	<u>Reel 5.</u> The Royal party on the "Heniesta" as they come alongside. The Royal party landing at Londonderry. The scene in the Guildhall Square, Londonderry.				
7.	Various crowd scenes in the Guildhall Square. Inspecting the Guard of Honour of the Royal Ulster Constabulary. March past of the various units.				
8.	GRAHAM THOMPSON COVERED THE MORE INTIMATE MATERIAL. VERY POOR WEATHER THROUGHOUT THE TOUR MAKING WHOLE STORY WEAK. COMPLETE LACK OF GENERAL VIEW MATERIAL.
