- The King will then be conducted from the Chair by The Speaker of the Schate who will Present the Members to His Majesty.
- The Clerk of Parliaments will Present the Senators to Her Majesty.
- The Governor will then Present the Speaker of the Commons who, in turn, will Present the Members to The King.
- The Assistant Clerk of Parliaments will Present the Members to The Queen.
- The Presentations having been completed both Speakers will conduct Their Majesties out of the Commons Chamber and The King and Queen will return to the Robing Rooms.
