The Prime Minister accompanied by Distinguished Visitors inspects the Parade from 1/2 tracked scout cars, they are seen passing anti-tank gunners of the Canadian Berlin Battalion. 1st The P.M. General Lyne, Monty Sir Alan Brooke, 2nd P.M. Alexander, etc. 3rd Eden and Attlee (who got a great cheer from the troops, 4th General Parkes C/O the Americans, Russian and French officers, 5th Mary Churchill and Mrs. Eden.

Passing along the line of British Armour, ourtroops were sporting their new Medal ribbons. The March Past, the P.M. and spectators. Taken as programs. First the Armour. The Royal Navy with Colours. 1st Batt. Grenadier Guards with the Kings and Regt. Colours. The Royal Air Force. End of Parade.
