They landed at Stoney Cross Aerodrome, between Southampton & Bournemouth and then drove in coaches to their new home, Wintersmill Hell, Durley, between Southampton & Portsmouth, which is the country home of Mr Sebag Montefiere and has been used by the N .F.S. during the war.
