The visit of the First Sea Lord and the First Lord of the Admiralty to the U.S.S. Enterprise. This is the first time that the ship has called at a British Port. She is taking American troops home, in time for Christmas.

Attached is the official dope and the names.

Mr Alexander is greeted by Admiral Hewitt on coming aboard Enterprise.

Admiral Cunningham and Mr Alexander address the men on the flight deck; but only the crew, none of the repatriated soldiers. The ceremony seems very flat.

The official party arrive and depart by barge.

The ship finally leaves in the fog.
