MR. J. B. HYND, THE CHANCELLOR OF THE DUCHY OF LANCASTER, M.P. IN BERLIN.

November 16th, 1945.

Mr. J. B. Hynd, M.P. who is the head of the newly formed department for German and Austrian Control Commission Affairs paid a visit to Berlin. He is seen in the Berliner Ring seeing off the last of the Berlin Children to be evacuated by operation "Stork" With Officers of the Control Commission he also paid a visit to Refugee camps in Berlin and talked to Germans - he speaks German. This is all part of the operation that is being planned for the Battle of the Winter.

German children take a peep at the toys. Preparations for Xmas in Berlin. A gift shop has been opened in one of the few shops to escape the R.A.F. bombing. Officers and Soldiers are seen choosing gifts of toys, Teddy-bears, perfumes, etc. They make a note of the number of the gift they want, hand it into their Unit, and in about ten days receive it to send home. Staff Sgt. Weeks of Cranbrook, Kent interests the "boys" in perfume. Misses bombshell L/Opl. Nina Robinson of Birmingham gets the lads interested in.....Toys. Various shots inside Gift shop in the Kurfurstendamm, Berlin's Bond Street. In the Winston Club we find Pte Marg Strachen of Aberdeen, Pte Norma Radley of Idlverpool (on ground) and Pte Meta Margaret Mary Thomson, from Scotland, decorating one of the many Xmas trees. Showing the boys some of the presents that will go on the Christmas trees. British Troops plan to have a good time at Xmas. In blitzed Berlin street markets have been set up and the people buy odds and ends to give them some Christmas cheer. The Pot mender. Ever-greens and painted flowers and berries are taken home to decorate the German homes. Before the burnt out shops the shop-keepers sell from stalls. Show cases in the Kurfurstendamm are used to sell flowers, a German Policeman looks on to see no black market deals are done under the cover of flowers. Shots for cut-ins outside Winston club, and the Gift shop signs.
