on the rocks at Sker Point, near Porthcawl, lies the seven-thousand ton oil-tanker Samtampa, smashed into three parts by the gale that swept the whole country. The crew of forty and the eight brave men of the Mumbles Lifeboat were all drowned. The lifeboat failed in its first attempt to reach the stricken tanker but though the fury of wind and sea did not abate the crew put out again. Some of the Samtampa's own sailors perished when the ship's beat was dashed onto the rocks.
