ANNUAL MID-WINTER FISHING TOURNAMENT ATTRACTS HUNDREDS OF ANGLERS

SCRAPPY STEELHEAD TROUT AVERAGE TEN POUNDS IN WEIGHT - FIGHTING QUALITY SECOND TO NONE

Vedder River, British Columbia, December 00, 1952

Trout fishing in Canada is usually confined to the spring and summer, but in British Columbia on the Vedder River, adjacent to Chilliwack, the Steelhead makes its appearance in December on its return to the ocean.

The Chilliwack Fish and Game Protective Association run their annual Steelhead Derby every Boxing Day (December 26) and it attracts anglers from all parts of the province - male, female and youngsters.

Bringing the Steelhead in after a strike requires plenty of skill for any angler. This battlin' trout averages ten pounds in weight and puts up a rip-snortin' fight. Such is the fighting quality that a high percentage are lost, tearing loose, or breaking tackle.

The Derby starts at 9 a.m. and concludes at 2:30 p.m. A gun is fired at 2:30 p.m. signifying the end of the Derby. Anglers must bring in each fish immediately it is caught, for weighing in.

The Honourable W. K. Kiernan, Minister of Agriculture for the province of B.C., awards prizes to the successful anglers participating in the Derby. George Land's steelhead, tipped the scales at thirteen and a half pounds, and he is dubbed "king fish" - winner of the Derby. His fish won the trophy and a hundred dollars in merchandise,
