MONTGOMERY MEETS BRADLEY IN CAPITAL

Special to THE NEW YORK Traces WASHINGTON, March 27— Field Marshal Viscount Mont-gomery, the Deputy Supreme Com-mander of Allied Forces in Europe, spent the first day of his visit to the Capital in a round of calls to his former comrades-in-arms and a conference at the Department

The Field Marshal is President Eisenhower's guest at the White House until next Thursday when he will start on a tour of United States military installations.

Field Marshal Montgomery inspected an all-service guard of honor. At the White House he did not immediately meet his kost, who was conducting his regular Cabinet meeting.
