The Queen has been graciously pleased to approve the award of the Gee M. to Airman Rees Leeming of the United States Airforce in recognition of his extreme gallantry on several occasions in resouing people who had been trapped in their houses at Hunstanton after attempts to get trapped people

by motor launch.... Airmen Leeming who is unable to swim seized a rubber launch and waded on his own into the..... to isolated homes, and in all brought 27 people to safety. He was in the water for 4 hours with his protective clothing damaged, and suffering from the effects of cold and exhaustion.....third trip he collapsed and was removed to hospital suffering from exhaustion.

Airman Leeming, it wise is with the greatest pleasure therefore that, in the name of Her Majesty the Queen I present you with the G. M. which Her Majesty has awarded to you in recognition of your outstanding gallantry in saving.

Life during the disastraus floods which occurred in B. Anglia on the night of M. Jon. of this year. We all admire the courage of the man who fully equipped goes into danger without counting the cost. Our highest admiration is reserved for the man who like you, Airman Rees Leeming, unable to swim, fully sware of the serious dangers which you face, nevertheless without counting the cost manner risks his own life to save the lives of others."
