EAST VS WEST "BATTLE OF BUTTER" IN GERMANY

You've read about Hungry East Berliners jamming the American sector of Berlin to buy Food at low prices.... this is the picture record documentation of the food offensive in the East-West struggle. The Reds had rejected President Eisenhower's offer of free food for Doviet-controlled East Germany.... but the people themselves show that empty stomachs can ignore an Iron Curtain.

The fresh fruits and milk and other foods are sold on an equal monetary babis, although actually the East Mark is worth only one-fifth the West Mark. And so the food front dominates the Cold War, even as despite the Communists' rejection, President Eisenhower orders that food be rushed to the frontiers of East Germany and East Berlin. At a New York pier, the first 28 hundred tons of foodstuffs collected by the Mutual Security Agency are loaded for shipment to Hamburg.... coffee, cocoa beans, powdered milk, flour and lard.

15 million dollars worth of food will reach the frontier. The Reds notwithstanding, East Germans will find it ready and waiting for their hungry mouths!
