SUNKEN DANISH SHIP RAISED

At Parkeston Quay, Harwich, lies the hull of the 4,000-ton Kronprins Frederik. The Danish vessel caught fire and capsimed there last April. Weeks of salvage operations and pumping are now rewarded. The cargo and passenger ship is raised, looking very much the worse for her experience, but to the eyes of experts well worth the effort. Her Skipper, Captain Lorriston, saw faith justified. The Liverpool and Glasgow Salvage Association are carrying out the final stage of the job. Weeks ago the underwater parts were sealed off. Now, the ship was pumped dry, she became bouyant and floated. The main saloon looks and awful mess.

However, it won't be long before the Kronprins Frederik is in a partition to be towed back to Benmark. There after a complete refit she's expected to be ready for sea again by next april. The salvage has cost a lot of money, but the owners and under-writers it's been well worth it.
