NOTE: Owing to te the short time available coverage rather limited Movietone and Cinesound covering the site more extensively after the Queen's departure.

NOTES: The Brown Coal Power and Duel undertaking of the Victoria State Electricity Commission at Yallourn is unique in the Southern Hemisphere. It produces nearly half of Victoria's Electricity and a great part of its solid fuel. Two Open Cuts are operated at Yallourn ... output 72 million sons annually. In the main seam there is an unbroken seam of coal averaging 200 ft in thickness. There are three dredgers winning coal at the rate of 18,000 tons a day for the power station and the briquette works.

NAME "YALLOURNI" IS DERIVED FROM TWO AUSTRALIAN ABORIGINAL WORDS YALLEEN ... meaning brown AND LOURN meaning fuel.


