ARRIVAL OF THE QUEEN AT LONDON AIRPORT 17th FEBRUARY, 1956

The B.O.A.C. Argonaut airliner, "Atalanta", bringing home the Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh from their Nigerian tour, is due at London Airport Central at 10 a.m. today. On arrival the Atalanta will taxi to Stand 11 of the central marshalling apron from which the Queen departed 21 days ago.

The Minister of Transport and Civil Aviation, Mr. Harold Watkinson, and the Aerodrome Commandant, Air Marshal Sir John D'Albiac, will then board the aircraft and waiting on the Apron to meet Her Majesty and His Royal Highness will be the Lord Lieutenant of Middlesex, Lord Latham, the Prime Minister, Sir Anthony Eden, members of the Cabinet, and the Nigerian Commissioners, who, with other members of the reception party, will have arrived at the Commandant's Suite between 9.45 a.m. and 9.50 a.m.

When Her Majesty appears at the top of the steps leading down from the aircraft the National Anthem will be played by the Central Band of the Royal Air Force. After being greeted by the Prime Minister and other members of the reception party the Queen will take leave of the aircrew.

Her Majesty will then inspect the Royal Air Force Guard of Honour which will be drawn up facing the aircraft. At the edge of the apron there will be a group of Nigerian cadets from Sandhurst and officers of the Nigerian Police from the Police College at Ryton-on-Dunsmore.

The Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh will leave the airport by car for Buckingham Palace direct from the apron.

THE QUEEN AND THE DUKE OF EDINBURGH RETURNED TO BRITAIN TODAY FROM THEIR TOUR OF NIGERIA .

THE ROYAL PLANE . THE ARGONAUT ATALANTA . TOUCHED DOWN

AT LONDON AIRPORT AT 10.52 AM.

QUEEN ELIZABETH THE QUEEN MOTHER AND PRINCESS MARGARET .*
WITH PRINCE CHARLES AND PRINCESS ANNE. ARRIVED AT LONDON AIRPORT
A QUARTER OF AN HOUR BEFORE THE ARRIVAL.

THE ARGONAUT, WHICH HAD BEEN "TALKED DOWN" FOR ITS FINAL APPROACH TO THE RUNWAY, LANDED SEVEN HOURS 24 MINUTES AFTER LEAVING IDRIS GTRIPOLID.

THE AIRCRAFT, AVERAGING 210 M.P.H., TOOK OFF FROM IDRIS AT 3.28 AM. ON THE 1.536- MILE RUN TO LONDON AIRPORT.

THE TOTAL FLYING TIME FOR THE 3,528- MILE THREE-STAGE LAGOS - LONDON FLIGHT TOOK 16 HOURS 14 MINUTES WITH STOPS AT KANO AND IDRIS .

12.4 PM. ROYAL CHILDREN GREET THEIR PARENTS PRINCE CHARLES AND PRINCESS ANNE WERE AT LONDON AIRPORT TODAY

TO SEE THEIR PARENTS HOME FROM NIGERIA:

THE IRREPRESSIBLE PRINCESS- IN BLUE AND CARRYING A BLUE FUR-TRIMMED MUFF- WAS FIRST UP THE STEPS AND INTO THE

AIRLINER"ATALANTA" WHEN THE DOOR WAS OPENED.

PRINCE CHARLES LEFT BEHIND AT THE BOTTOM OF THE STEPS ALMOST RAN PAST THE QUEEN MOTHER AS HE GOT TO THE TOP IN ORDER TO CATCH UP WITH HIS SISTER.

DURING THE RECEPTION ON THE MARSHALLING APRON, PRINCESS ANNE FOLLOWED HER MOTHER EVERYWHERE, ONLY LEAVING HER WHEN THE QUEEN WENT TO INSPECT THE R.A.F. GUARD OF HONOUR. THE QUEEN AFTER THE SUNSHINE OF NIGERIA CLEARLY FELT THE

COLD .

AFTER THE AIRCRAFT HAD TAXIED IN A STEWARDESS WENT ABOARD CARRYING FUR COATS FOR THE QUEEN AND HER LADY IN WAITING THE COUNTESS OF EUSTON .

THERE WERE ALSO OVERCOATS FOR THE DUKE AND MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE'S HOLD. THE QUEEN COULD BE SEEN LOOKING OUT OF A WINDOW AS THE ATRCRAFT AXIED INTO ITS FINAL POSITION. THERE WERE HAND WAVES FROM THE TWO CHILDREN AND FROM THE QUEEN MOTHER AND PRINCESS

THE QUEEN MOTHER. PRINCESS MARGARET WITH PRINCE CHARLES AND PRINCESS ANNE WERE IN THE AIRCRAFT ONLY A FEW MINUTES.

MR HAROLD WATKINSON, THE MINISTER OF TRANSPORT AND CIVIL AVIATION, BOARDED THE ATRCRAFT WITH THE ATRPORT COMMANDANT, AIR MARSHAL SIR JOHN D'ALBIAC.

WATTING TO MEET THE QUEEN ON THE TARMAC, WERE SIR ANTHONY EDEN., MAJOR LEDYD GEORGE. AND MR LENNOX - BOYD.

ONE OF THE NIGERIAN COMMISSIONERS IN THE ECEPTION PARTY WORE LONG FLOWING ROBES AND A YELLOW TURBAN WHICH FASCINATED PRINCE CHARE AND PRINCESS ANNE.

THE CHILDREN FOLLOWED THEIR PARENTS ACROSS THE TARMAC WHEN THEY WENT OVER TO TALK TO A GROUP OF NIGERIAN CADETS FROM SANDHURST. AND OFFICERS OF THE NIGERIAN POLICE ATTENDING THE POLICE COLLEGE AT RYTON-ON-DUNSMORE.

THEN , THE TWO EXCITED ROYAL CHILDREN DROVE AWAY WITH THEIR PARENTS:

CHEERING CROWDS SWARMED ROUND THE ROYAL CAR AS IT DROVE SLOWLY

THE QUEEN AND THE DUKE SMILED GAILY AND WAVED AS THE ONLOOKERS STRUGGLED FOR VANTAGE POINTS.

THE WWARMTH OF HER RCEPTION OUTSIDE THE GATES WAS PERHAPS EVEN EXCEED BY THAT GIVEN THE QUEEN BY NIGERIAN STUDENTS LINING THE FORECOURT. THEY SHOUTED AND WAVED COLOURED HANDKERCHIEFS, AND PRESENTING A VERY COLOURFUL SCENE.
