Leaving her berth with masts down to give clearance under the bridges, this newcomer among the flat-tops, designated by the Navy as CVA 60, is actually "some baby"biggest and most powerful warship afloat! First the Manhattan Bridge, and now the famed Brooklyn Bridge, oldest and lowest of New York's East River spans.

Painting a spectacular portrait against the Manhattan skyline, the ten-hundred-and-thirty-nine foot Saratoga is scheduled for her shakedown cruise in August.

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
