

PRESIDENT TITO VISITS A COLLECTIVE FARM

On touring through the ~~Southwestern~~ Southern Regions of the Soviet Union, Josip Broz Tite, President of the Federative People's Republic of Yugoslavia, his wife, Nikita Khrushchev, Member of the USSR Supreme Soviet Presidium and First Secretary of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union, and Anastas Mikoyan, First Vice-Chairman of the USSR Council of Ministers visit a collective farm at the Cossack village of Grigoripolisskaya of Stavropol Region.

Thousands of collective farmers line the village streets to welcome the guests.

According to a traditional Russian custom, one of the oldest collective farmers greets the President of the Federative People's Republic of Yugoslavia with a loaf of bread and salt.

Later at the Collective Farm's summer theatre a public meeting is held. Speeches are made by Josip Broz Tite, Anastas Mikoyan and Nikita Khrushchev.

PRESIDENT TITO TOURING THE SOVIET UNION

Josip Broz Tito, President of the Federative People's Republic of Yugoslavia, who is on an official visit in the U.S.S.R. is making a tour through the Soviet Union. On the 11th June, President Tito, Nikita Khrushchov, Member of the USSR Supreme Soviet Presidium and First Secretary of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union and Anastas Mikoyan, First Vice-Chairman of the USSR Council of Ministers arrive in Stalingrad.

Together with them arrive the President's wife, and other officials accompanying the President.

A Guard of Honour is drawn up in honour of the President. To welcome the guests, about 100,000 Stalingraders have gathered on the square outside the Station and the adjacent streets.

As the guests are coming out of the Station, a public meeting is held on the square.

Josip Broz Tito and Nikita Khrushchov address the public.
