A Vanwall left at the start, 28 of the world's best racing cars, Stirling Moss in a Maserati, were away in the ninth British Grand Prix. World champion Fangio drove a Ferrari. Misfortune again for the B.R.M.s. Tony Brooks overturned and the car burnt out. Tony only slightly hurt. The race was 303 miles; 101 laps.
