## CASTING OF "BIG BEL工 OF BOW"

The casting of the "Big Bell of Bow", the great Tenor Bell of St. Mary-le-Bow, and its naming ceremony by the Rector and Churchwardens, will take place on Friday, July 20th at 3.0 p.m. in the Whitechapel Bell Foundry, Whitechapel Road.

This bell is the direct descendant of the old Curfew Bell, first time-signal of London. In 1334 it was ordered to be rung at 8.0 p.me, and its sound is said to have been heard on Highgate Hill by Dick Whittington in 1375. It was destroyed in the Fire of London, 1666, recast in 1669, and destroyed again in 1941. It is now being cast aggin from the old metal and will be named "Bow" by the Rector (The Rev. Hugh Evan Hopkins) to commemorate its long history.

On its 'shoulder' will be inscribed the words from the evening Canticle "Now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace for mine eyes have seen thy salvation". Round the "soundbow" there is, as with all the new bells, a decorative border of "London Pride".

London should be proud of her new Curfew bell, the largest of the 12 Bow Bells, watting now the chance to ring again from a restored Church and steeple.

The ceremony will be attended by the Lord Mayor who will pay a tribute to the long association of Bow Tenor with the City, and with his predecessor in office, Dick Whittington. The Masters of the Turners' Company and the Founders' Company, both of which have contributed generously to the cost of the casting, will be associated with the Lord Mayor in casting coins into the furnace at the ceremony.
