RECORDS SET AT HOME AND ABROAD

Berlin. U.S. cbloured soldier Willie Williams set a new world 100-metre record in 10.1 seconds, one-tenth of a second faster than Jesse Owens' time in 1936. Murchison, Next day another U.S. soldier, Ira Munchimann, also ran the 100 metres in 10.1. Provo Wille Wras the 100 metres in 10.1. Meanwhile in London, great Britain defeated Czecholslovakia in the match sponsored by the News of the World. In the three-mile race Ibbotson and Norris opposed Graf and Kristof.

With a finely judged effort in the last lap Ibbotson spurted past Graf in unbeatable fashion.

In the excellent time of 13-minutes, 28.2 Ibbotson won the event for Britain.

The 100 yards. Young and Sandstrom representing Britain. The 18-year-old Warwic kshire schoolboy John Young won the race in 10-seconds.... A sprinter in the world-class.

Now the 4- by-110-yards relay. Young, Sandstrom, Breacher and Shenton ran for Britain..... The British four won in 41.6-seconds, .3-seconds faster than the Czechs.
