We assume, Mr. President, that the conference will not fail but will succeed, and I believe that by the conference we will invoke moral forces which are bound to prevail. Mr. President, you and I have often talked bout our Declaration of Independence and the principles which are set forth in that great document and one of those principles is that which our founders pledged themselves that they would have pay a decent respect for the opinions of mankind. I believe, Mr. President, that most people pay decent respect for the opinions of mankind when they are soberly, carefully and dehiberately formulated. And because I believe that I am confident that out of this conference will come a judgement of such moral force that we can be confident that the Suez Canal will gon on as it has for the last 100 years for the years in the future to serve in peace the interests of mankind.
