RELIEF OFTOLEDO.

Bilbao is the latest name in Spain to flame into headlines as a centre of destruction. As the troops on one side or the other advance, they march through cities that recentle the ruins of a forther fermar civilisation --- the wreckage of buildings and bridges --the debris that failer lies in the path of opposing factions in of the same nation. On the road to Toledo our cameraman secured these vivid pictures of the insurgents' advance to relieve their comrades besieged in the Alcazar fortress for 71 days. The wreckage of an occasional aeroplane, grim though it is, pales into insignificance as the awful ruin of the Alcazar itself comes into view. Cautiously the rebel troops advance, expecting every corner to send a whistling messenger of death. The historic siege of the Alcazar is General Franco, accompanied by gaunt and bearded General Mescardo who commanded the beleagured garrison, walks in grim silence through the shattered streets Amid the ruins, haggard inhabitants of the city of siege eat and exercise after many weeks of imprisonment and semi-starvation. General Franco spoke with great emotion to the tran troops who had scarcely strength enough to stand to attention. congratulated them on their cois resistants in his cause. He embraced Concral Moscarde as he recrated him with Spain's V.C .. In a story of the horrors that war inevitably brings, this has been the most terrible of all
