The great glees Crystal Palace which has been a London landmark for more than eighty years has gone. Every fir e brigade in London was called to Sydenham following a small outbreak starting in the early evening which soon encompassed the entire building and defied all xxx efforts to subdue it. Flames wrapped the glass and steel building from end to end, while the 280-foot towers stood out like tall ghosts, surveying the scene of destruction. From one of those one daumont British News Comeramen was exposing the film -- risking his lifewhile the base of the tower was burning. Flying above the blaze the G Gaumont British News aerial cameraman was on the job too --- watch how he swooped down almost diving through the fire itself in a spectaculab swoop along the giant building. Flames ripped and crackled their in their terrifying career of destruction as they wrecked the ancient scene of countless exhibitions. It seems mireaulous that nobody was killed and even injuries were comparatively few.
