O'Brien and Bradman fell to successive balls from Voce, and McCabe fell to the next but one. All out for eighty, Australia followed on, ~~and in this second innings~~ ^{then} Fingleton scored 73. Allen's wisdom in forcing the follow on was doubted by the critics when Bradman made 82 and McCabe 93, but England's victory was by an innings and 22 runs.
