Battering attacks on the Manchester City goal led to the home side of forst trumph --playing his first Cup Tie for Millwall, Barker sent a header flying into the City net. half time --- bring out the lemons! In the second half Manchester City brought on all the fool ball they knew be force an equiliser but while the minutes slipped and the home side kept their end up. Then came another Millwall goal --this time Mangnall got his head to it and scored ----- Millwall 2 Manchester City nil. That was the score at the final whistle --and the crowd again went surking over the pitch --- cheering the only Third Division side ever to reach the semi-final
