Coronation crowds at Windsor were almosyt as thick as those in London. It was at Windsor that their Majesties spent the week-end following this most important week, and Windsor was duly conscious of its place in the world's eye. Coronation fever in London persisted long after the wvent. Every street was packed with sight-seers who thronged around the decorations which transformed that our sober capital into a gay fairyland. The day following the & Coronation wound up with a grand ball at the Albert Hall. It was attended by the Duke and Duchess of Kent, the Duke and Duchess of Gloucester, the Crown Prince and Princess of Sweden, Princess Juliana and Prince Bernhard, and Princess and Princess Chichibu. Pages of history came to life as 2 7,000 dancers teek the floor. Less expensive, though no less gay, were the scenes in the streets outside. And taxa from London, wrapped in its mantle of floodlighting, to the world beyond came these memorable words from His Majesty King George VI.
