rifty-two nations assembled at Geneva have joined in condemning the horrors perpetrated by Japan in their war against China. As the national representatives have voted, as so each decent-fhinking individual is appalled by the massacres that as have taken place on land and sea. In the bombing of open towns by Japanese aircraft, thousands of innocent civilians have lost their lives. Many who are no more than babies have been left in a world of desolation and despair --- bewildered and alone. Mere words are inadequate to condemn these horrors --- this is war at its very worst. Hear the speech of Dr Wellington Koo, Chinese delegate to the League of Nations.

From Japan we turn to Germany. A parade of soldiers, storm-troopers and special guards massed at the station at Munich to greet the visiting dictator. Herr Hitler welcomed Signor Mussolini --- and a bomb proof, bullettproof, shock-proof wall of troops protected them from the crowd. The world looks on at this famous Rome-Berlin axis, around which all Europe dizzily spins --- wondering if it stands for peace or war. Mussolini supplied the answer to the question in his speech at Berlin. It was Peace, he said --- and we hope fervently that it will be peace.
