Two thousand troops from all branches of the service, stood to attention in Whitehall for the ceremony of unveiling the monument to Britain's Commander in the Field during the Great War. The Duke of Gloucester was present to perform the unveiling and those who listened to his speech included the present Earl Hail and members of the family.
