Endeavour II tried to regain the America's Cup, but failed. The laurels went to Endeavour I. After the tow-rope had broken in mid-ocean, Captain Heard and his gallent crew brought her through Atlantic storms --- an epic of seamanship. Jean Batten crowned her achievements with a wonderful flight from Australia --- the record girl established another record. Flying Officer Clouston and Mrs Kirby Green broke all records to the Cape and back. The commercial flying boat Caledonia made a magnificent test flight across the Atlantic to New York.
