In Bray in Berkshire, the Marquess of Milford Haven was laid wee laid to rest. Those who mourned included his brother, Lord Lauis Mountbatten and Lady Lauis, the Duke and Duchess of Kent and King George --- for Lord Milford Haven was second cousin of our king After the church service the sailormarquess was borne to the cemetery a mile away --- the guncarriage which bore his coffin drawn by satings from H.M.S. Excellent Following the coffin was an officer with his medals and orders and his heir, the young Earl of Medina, walked with Lord Lauis. Through those quiet lanes, where the green leaf of a new life was beginning to show, this solemn procession of death menched deaty Member foreign royal families --from Greece, Sweden, Denmark and Russia also followed while the bank or the Royal marines filled the air Wien the music of Charles Funoral March.

So into the peaceful cemetery beside the River Thames came this company of mourners; to listen to the moving words of the burial service; to hear the volleyed salute of a naval guard of honour and the last post of the bugles.
