

GARDEN PARTY AT HAMPTON COURT.

Meanwhile another centenary celebration was attended by Royalty at Hampton Court. The Palace was opened to the public 100 years ago, and to mark the occasion Queen Mary with the Duke and Duchess of Kent were present at a garden party. Amongst notable people there was Cardinal Hinsley, Archbishop of Westminster. There was much to see - for the Palace has a wealth of history behind it. The Tudor kitchen and the windows and roof of the Royal Chapel, ~~the Queen's~~ ^{and} Queen's drawing room, with its wall and ceiling paintings, ~~the King's~~ ^K Guard Chamber, - all these have been restored closely to their original condition.

The sunshine and gay coloured frocks seemed to belie the grimness of the Tower, and its lawn was a pleasant place. There were many overseas visitors at the party, and they were specially interested in the bright uniforms and flower-wreathed hats of the yeomen warders.
