

KING AND QUEEN AT DOVER AND BOULOGNE.

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And so to Dover where the Admiralty yacht Enchantress lay at her moorings. The Channel was veiled in fog, and as their Majesties arrived, King George inspected the naval guard of honour drawn up on the quayside, and the King and Queen were piped on board to the accompaniment of sirens and cheering. We take a last glimpse of their Majesties from English soil as the Enchantress moves slowly away into the sea mist- her course set for Boulogne. R.A.F. planes flew overhead as the yacht made her way across to the French coast. British destroyers with our cameramen on board, and in the air, accompanied the Enchantress. At a point in mid-channel the yacht was met by an escort of French cruisers, headed by the new armoured cruiser Dunkerque. And as the Enchantress steamed towards Boulogne, a dramatic moment arrived when the vessel drew level with a grey stone memorial of Britannia erected to the memory of 5,000,000 British men and women who landed at Boulogne in the war. M. Bonnet, France's foreign Minister, with Sir Eric Phipps, British Ambassador, ~~boarded the yacht and~~ officially welcomed the King and Queen to French soil.
