LORD BALDWIN AND JEWISH REFUGEES

When Earl Baldwin broadcast ^{his} appeal for Jewish Refugees from Germany, he spoke as an ordinary Englishman shocked and distressed by the plight of a despised and rejected people and their innocent children. He pleaded for help for the victims of the Nazi regime who turned to England for succour. He spoke of thousands of men and women despoiled of their goods --- driven from their homes, seeking a hiding place from the wind --- seeking sanctuary on our doorstep. He called it a world's good cause --- for these were victims not of any catastrophe of the natural world --- not of earthquake nor flood nor famine --- but of man's inhumanity to man. ~~Mass emigration cannot be arranged at a moment's notice; but while the preliminary arrangements are being done, these~~ *meanwhile* ~~child refugees from Germany who have found shelter in Britain are being cared for and are learning to play a useful part in the nation's work.~~
