GERMAN FLEET IN THE ENGLISH CHANNEL.

The German Fleet left Heligoland for exercises in Spanish waters and for two days it was missing. Airplanes with cameramen ready, posted at vantage points along the route, took off at intervals but without ~~righting anything~~ result. But on the evening of the second day the Gaumont British News aerial cameraman flew out over the English Channel and sighted the leader --- the pocket battleship Admiral Graf Spee.

Next came the other pocket battleship Deutschland. The main reason for the so-called disappearance was that the Fuehrer's Fleet had steamed much slower than was anticipated.

Following the pocket battleships --- the oil tanker Friedrich Drene. Then a supply ship.

And a casualty. The convoy ship Samland was towing the Destroyer No. 32 which was in trouble. This probably accounted for some of the delay. Two ~~destroyers~~ light cruisers were standing by.

Next in line, over a stretch of many miles in the Straits of Dover, more light cruisers and destroyers.

To end the parade --- submarines. Putting on a splash of speed as our film plane flies overhead --- Submarines 37, 51, 45, 46, 47 and 39.
