COBB RECORD.

Utah --- John Cobb has again broken the world's land speed record on Bonneville Salt Flats. The previous speed was 357.53 miles an hour, by Captain Eyston in 1938. Cobb's first run for the new record was at the colossal speed of 370.75 miles an hour. His return run at 366.95 gave him an average speed of 368.85 miles an hour --- over six miles a minute.
