Repeated raids by Nazi bombers along the coast of Scotland have ~~demonstrated~~ ^{shown} that Britain's defences against air attack are a formidable barrier to any raiders. ~~The attack on the Firth of Forth resulted in comparatively little damage and the raiders suffered heavy losses.~~ Captain Livingstone of the Ferry, ^{Firth of Forth} was one of the eye witnesses.

Anti-aircraft fire and British fighter aircraft brought down at least four of the raiders, ~~and several others.~~ The fishing boat Dayspring rescued the crew of one of the bombers brought down in the Firth of Forth.

Wounded airmen were taken to hospital by ambulance --- the first Germans captured on British soil in this war..... to receive the same treatment, as prisoners of war, as would be given to our own wounded. And in the hospital, ~~in conversation with British military authorities,~~ they seem to be comfortable and happy.

And while our cameraman interviewed these German airmen ~~in a hospital,~~ ^{he heard another warning!} ~~warning of another raid on Scotland was heard.~~

The ~~warning~~ sirens ~~urgently~~ emptied the streets --- but whether it was another attempted raid or a reconnaissance flight, it failed. A.-A. guns and fighters drove them back immediately.
