The Scot went down a third time and was counted out. This round lasted only one minute eighteen seconds. Abrew was badly hurt and it was some time before his seconds could help him from the ring. It has been said that Tommy cannot punch hard, he proved this statement false by the power he put behind his blows. His victory will encourage him to win back the British and Empire Titles from Len Harvey.
