BLOOD TRANSFUSION.

Blood given by the American Red Cross is now being receive d in large quantities in Britain.

On arrival, the wooden cases containing the precious bottles are opened and texted severe tests are made.

A sample is withdrawn from the selected bottle by syringe and inoculated into a bacteriological growth.

Then the inoculated bottles are placed in an incubator at blood temperature. ***Example If, after a week's incubation they have shown no strength of backeria, them the bottle of blood plasma and the batch grom which it wame are judged sterile and are issued forthwith to the transfusion centres.

More than I000 litre bottles of this blood have been sent, representing 2000 individual donors.

The value of blood transfusion has been very great in cases
